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Characterisation of the drama Mrichchhakatikam Soma Bandyopadhyay

In characterisation point of view Sudraka is the first dramatist who collected his dramatic character from every corner of the society. The dramatist created many characters in his drama Mrichchhakatikam. Those characters were devided into two catagories: (a) Major characters and (b) Minor characters. Major characters were direct by related to the main plot and they helped to progress the drama smoothly. On the other hand, the minor characters developed the drama; and they also charmed the readers and avidience. In this drama we see that the hero and the sophisticated characters spoke in classical language, while heroine, females and other minor characters spoke in the different prakrit dialects.

Charudatta

In Mrichchhakatikam Sudraka selected his heroi named charudatta. He was a young brahmana and he lived in 'Ujjayine", 'Ujjayini' was the famous place in ancient India. At that time many rich persons (vanika) lived in Ujjayini. Charudatta's ancestors were very richmen, but unfortunately those wealth disappeared at the time or charudatta. Now charudatta is a poor man, but he is home and famous for his greatness and kindness. His name is most meaningful 2, with his moral character. Charudutta 'he who pives noble'. He spent his money for public welfare3 and for himself too. Bountifulness is a bahitwhis become a second mature with him, so that, when he has nothing Valueable to give away, he parts with the very cloak he happens to be wearing. Charudatta is an honourable man. His high sense of honour makes him to replace the stolen ornaments by a costly necklace. For such nobleness he could able to win the heart of a beautiful, rich and young courtesan.

In Mrichchhakatika's First Act we can see that now Charudatta is a poor man and he laments over his lengthy great poverty 5. According to some critics, charu's lamention over his poverty in the first act is very unbe coming for a great man like him. In support of their statement they point out that charu's desires for his present condition, not because he is there by deprived of the opportunities of doing good to others. He is very sincero for his
